ADVANCED LEVEL GRADES

A pass in an Advanced level subject is indicated by one of the five Grades A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), of which Grade A(a) is the highest and Grade E(e) is the lowest.

Grade N(n) indicates that the candidate's performance fell short of the standard required for Grade E(e) by a narrow margin.

The endorsement 'With Geography Project' to a result in Advanced level Geography indicates that the candidate submitted an **optional** project and that an unofficial grade of at least E(e) on the Advanced level grading scale was awarded for the project. The Geography Project is not a separate subject and is not therefore included in the number of Advanced level subjects recorded.

The grades for the Special Paper are Grade 1 (Distinction) and Grade 2 (Merit).

ADVANCED SUPPLEMENTARY GRADES

A pass in an Advanced Supplementary subject is indicated by one of the five Grades A(a), B(b), C(c), D(d), E(e), of which Grade A(a) is the highest and Grade E(e) is the lowest.

Grade N(n) indicates that the candidate's performance fell short of the standard required for Grade E(e) by a narrow margin.

Examinations in AS subjects are of the same standard as examinations in Advanced level subjects, but AS syllabuses cover about half the subject content of Advanced level syllabuses.
